B. Summary

This Department's definition of a Dropout is "a pupil who leaves school for any reason except death before graduation or completion of a program of studies and without transferring to another school."

Data show the range of dropouts by County for the 1975-76 school-year is from 37 students out of a total secondary school population of 919 in Piscataquis to 602 out of a total student population of 13,550 in Cumberland with respective percentages being 4.0 and 4.4. The range of dropouts at first glance could be considered drastic, however, in looking at the total student population it is quite insignificant. The percentages of student dropouts range from a low of 2.9% for Franklin County to a high of 6.7% for Washington County. The 1975-76 overall average percentage for dropouts is 4.5%.

Our most recent data (November 1976) show 136 school districts reporting on the status of positive action committees (as required by recent legislation) with 96 districts having formed committees, 16 districts have not formed committees, and 24 districts are not affected by the law.

SUSPENSIONS AND EXPULSIONS

This Department does not have current statistical data for student suspension and expulsion. School Districts will be requested to report this 1976-77 school-year statistics on suspension/expulsion in June of 1977 to this Department. The reported data will include the categories for which students were suspended or expelled.

The following table represents a survey done in 1972-73 by the Children's Defense Fund of the Washington Research Project, Inc. and included one school district, Portland, out of the entire state:
