EXECUTIVE ORDER

by the

Governor of Maine

In order to insure the more complete and reliable recording of archeological data and remains both past and present, a study be undertaken during the remainder of this year and all of 1968 into the present status of our archeological and early historical heritage.

It is hereby ordered that the Department of Economic Development and Robert G. Doyle, State Geologist and Director of the Maine Geological Survey be assigned as time and duties permit to conduct the investigation; and

Be it further ordered that other State agencies which may be able to provide information and assistance do so within the limits of their organization; and

Be it further ordered that the purpose of this Executive Order is to provide the Governor with information so that he may be able to prepare legislation if such is required to set up an Archeological and Early Historical Council. This Council will have the responsibility for maintaining vigilance over archeological work in the State and in the retrieval of already collected data and material.

I appeal to all those who have archeological and early historical materials or information to assist the Department of Economic Development and Mr. Doyle in compiling the required information.
