MAINE REPRESENTATIVE TO THE
NEW ENGLAND RIVER BASINS COMMISSION

Effective July 7, 1969, Mr. Philip M. Savage, State Planning Director, will replace Mr. Austin H. Wilkins, Forest Commissioner, as the State of Maine Representative on the New England River Basins Commission. Mr. Wilkins will continue his connection with the River Basins Commission as alternate representative; Mr. Charles L. Boothby, Executive Secretary of the Soil and Water Conservation Commission, will serve as a second alternate representative to the Commission.

This action is taken to further implement The State Planning Act of 1968 which created a State Planning Office to coordinate and develop the many planning responsibilities of State Government and has, as one of its major duties, the responsibility for inter-governmental planning of an interstate nature.

Because the New England River Basins Commission is a Federal-State agency established to plan and coordinate plans for use and development of water and related land uses in the New England Region, it is appropriate that the State Planning Office represent Maine to coordinate state planning activities with those of this regional agency.
