AREA PLANNING AGENCIES ON AGING

WHEREAS, the State of Maine should continue to be regarded as one of the most progressive states in the provision of comprehensive services to our elderly, and

WHEREAS, these services should be provided over an even wider area of our State,

NOW, THEREFORE, I KENNETH M. CURTIS, Governor of the State of Maine, pursuant to Section 304(A) of the "Older Americans Comprehensive Services Amendment of 1973" designate the following agencies as Area Planning Agencies on Aging within these respective geographic areas within the State of Maine:

- I. Cumberland and York Task Force
Cumberland and York Counties excluding the Brunswick area
- II. Western Maine Task Force on Aging
Franklin, Androscoggin and Oxford Counties
- III. Central Maine Task Force on Aging
Knox, Lincoln, Sagadahoc, Kennebec, Somerset Counties plus the Brunswick area in Cumberland County.
- IV. Eastern Maine Task Force on Aging
Piscataquis, Penobscot, Hancock, Washington and Waldo County
- V. Aroostook Regional Task Force of Older Citizens
Aroostook County
