RESOLVE, Authorizing the Setting Out of Buoys in Moosehead Lake.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the waters of Moosehead Lake are used by many boats of all sizes; and

Whereas, the dangerous areas of the lake should be marked to eliminate the hazards to life and limb; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Setting out of buoys in Moosehead Lake authorized. Resolved: That the Public Utilities Commission be directed to set out in Moosehead Lake properly marked buoys in such places where, in the opinion of the Public Utilities Commission, a hazard to boating exists; and be it further

Resolved: That there be appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$15,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962 to carry out the purposes of this resolve; said appropriation shall not lapse but shall remain a continuous carrying account until June 30, 1963.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Properly marked buoys should be set out, under the direction of the Public Utilities Commission, in many dangerous areas on Moosehead Lake to eliminate boating hazards.
