AN ACT Abolishing the Merrymeeting Bay Game Sanctuary.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 149. That part of section 149 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, which relates to Merrymeeting Bay Game Sanctuary, is repealed.

'Merrymeeting Bay Game Sanctuary: A game sanctuary shall be established in Merrymeeting Bay bounded as follows: On the west by a line drawn from a marker located near high water mark and near a cedar tree marking the lot line between Kelleys Field and the Fishing Lot, so called; running south approximately 400 yards to a red stake or marker; thence southeasterly approximately 1,900 yards to a red marker located near high water mark on the northwestern most tip of Elliots Point, so called; thence northeasterly following high water mark approximately 1,250 yards to a red marker under the overhead power cables; thence northwesterly approximately 550 yards to a red marker near high water mark under the overhead power cables on Kelleys Point; thence westerly along high water mark to original point of beginning.'
