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**RESOLVE, Reimbursing Town of Canton for Aid Extended to Kenneth Crocker and Family.**

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**Town of Canton, reimbursed. Resolved:** That there be appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$732.35 to be paid to the Town of Canton to reimburse the town for aid extended to Kenneth Crocker and Family, state paupers.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In 1951 and 1952 the Town of Canton paid to the Town of Jay the sum of \$732.35 on account of Kenneth Crocker and family, who were then residing in the Town of Jay.

This family had previously lived in the Town of Canton in 1939 and 1940 and settled on the Town of Farmington by the State Department of Health and Welfare. By mistake the Overseers of Canton accepted the family as wards and paid the Town of Jay for their support. Upon investigation it was learned that Kenneth Crocker was settled in Farmington in 1940 and had not lost his settlement there. Therefore it would seem that the Town of Canton should be reimbursed for the sum spent on this family during 1951 and 1952.
