# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

#### AN ACT to Provide for Training of Plumbers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 25, §§ 185-A - 185-C, additional.** Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding 3 new sections 185-A, 185-B, 185-C, to read as follows:

'Sec. 185-A. Apprenticeship for journeyman plumber. Each applicant for examination to obtain a journeyman plumber's license shall present to the board evidence that he has served a period of training as follows:

At least a school year of not less than 9 months in a technical trade school approved by said board, or in lieu thereof shall have served a period of apprenticeship under the immediate supervision of a licensed plumber for a period of not less than 36 months. The board is authorized to adopt rules providing for the keeping of records and reporting the time spent and under whom such apprenticeship is served.

Sec. 185-B. Master plumber to serve as journeyman. Each applicant for a master plumber's license shall present evidence to the board that he has served as a licensed journeyman plumber for a period of not less than 36 months.

Sec. 185-C. Service in another state. Any person presenting evidence that he has actually served in another state equivalent time and training, either as a journeyman or master plumber, shall be considered eligible for examination.'
