RESOLVE, Increasing State Pension for Mrs. Katie Libby of Charleston.

Mrs. Katie Libby; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$60 per month be granted to Katie Libby, of Charleston, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin July 1, 1961, and continue until otherwise provided by the Legislature.

That part of the resolves of 1957, chapter 123, which provided for a state pension for Katie Libby, Charleston, is repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Libby own a farm in Charleston where she is now residing. She and her husband made a good living on the farm until he had a shock and became paralyzed. Mr. Libby died in 1947. Mrs. Libby continued to carry on the farm as long as she was able. Now the farm is run down and the income is not sufficient to pay the taxes. She has no other income. Mrs. Libby has the distinction of being the only known living granddaughter of a Revolutionary soldier.
