SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to H. P. 1074, L. D. 1481, Bill, "An Act
Regulating Catching Lobsters While Swimming or Diving."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the underlined
"Sec. 68-A." and inserting in place thereof the following underlined
section:

"Sec. 68-A. Catching lobsters for commercial purposes by
other than conventional method illegal. It is unlawful to fish for
or catch lobsters for commercial purposes from the coastal waters
of the State by any method other than the conventional method of
lobster traps or pots.

I. Daily bag limit for other than commercial purposes. In
the case of catching by any method other than the conventional
traps or pots, a 5 lobster daily bag limit for other than
commercial purposes is set.

II. Definition. A "lobster trap or pot" for the purposes of
this section shall be held to mean a stationary device set
on the ocean bottom and commonly used along the Maine coast
for catching lobsters.'"
