STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Reciprocal Enforcement of Violations of Boating Law in Boundary Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 36-A, § 12-A, additional. Chapter 36-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 349 of the public laws of 1959, is amended by adding section 12-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 12-A. Reciprocity. Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary, the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is empowered to make agreements or arrangements with the duly authorized representatives of the State of New Hampshire and a Province of Canada providing that boats owned by residents of such bordering state or province may be operated on any waters or portions thereof lying between the State of Maine and the State of New Hampshire or a Province of Canada, provided such boats are operated in conformity with the laws of such state or province. Such agreements or arrangements shall provide equivalent benefits and privileges for residents of this State.'
