## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

#### RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Certain Waters in York County.

Fishing in certain waters in York County; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue rules and regulations as follows:

Opening the season on trout in York County on April 1st in waters naturally free of ice and all portions of waters naturally free of ice, except rivers, streams and brooks and reclaimed ponds, which open the last Saturday in April.

Establishing the open season on suckers, hornpout, eels, yellow perch, white perch, sunfish and pickerel in York County from April 1st through October 15th with the general law on limit to prevail.

Opening that part of Folly Pond, York, known as Upper Folly Pond, to fishing under the general law.

Opening Littlefield Pond, Sanford, to fishing under the general law.

Establishing a daily limit of 5 fish from Isinglass Pond, Waterboro, Limington.

Opening and classifying Kittery Club Pond, Kittery, open as a reclaimed pond, under the general law, except no outboard motors shall be permitted on this pond.

Closing Kennebunk Pond, Lyman, to ice fishing until February 1st.

Closing Swan Pond, Lyman, to ice fishing until February 1st.

Closing Isinglass Pond, Waterboro, Limington, to ice fishing.

Opening Littlefield Pond, Sanford, to ice fishing.

Opening that part of Folly Pond, York, known as Upper Folly Pond, to ice fishing.
