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### **AN ACT Providing for County Industrial and Recreational Development Personnel.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. R. S., c. 89, § 16-C, additional.** Chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 16-C, to read as follows:

‘**Sec. 16-C. Industrial and recreational development.** The county commissioners of each county, by obtaining the consent of their respective counties, are authorized to select and employ from a list of 3 persons submitted by the Commissioner of Economic Development an industrial and recreational director to aid in planning the county’s economic and recreational growth and development. The county commissioners may employ such clerical personnel as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this section. The expenses and salaries of such director and personnel shall be paid for as follows: 50% by the State and 50% by the county, provided that the State’s share shall be limited and apportioned by the amount of legislative appropriation and provided that any county’s share shall be limited to not more than \$10,000 annually.’

**Sec. 2. Appropriation.** There is appropriated to the Department of Economic Development from the General Fund the sum of \$20,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964 and the sum of \$20,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965 to carry out the purposes of this act.
