STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Make Allocations from Bond Issue for Construction and Equipment of Pollution Abatement Facilities.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the Water Improvement Commission will become due and payable prior to May 31, 1965; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Allocation. From the proceeds of the sale of bonds for construction and equipment of pollution abatement facilities—from July 1, 1964 to June 30, 1965, from July 1, 1965 to June 30, 1966 and from July 1, 1966 to June 30, 1967—shall be segregated, apportioned and expended as designated in the following schedule:

1964-65 1965-66 1966-67

WATER IMPROVEMENT COMMISSION

*Municipal Sewerage

All Other \$700,000 \$1,300,000 \$2,500,000

*(Any balance shall not lapse but shall be carried forward from year to year to be expended for the same purposes.)

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
