AN ACT Providing for a Legislative Recess Committee to Study Consolidation of School Districts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Committee. There is created a Legislative Recess Committee to study the feasibility of consolidating the school districts of the State into a lesser number of more efficient size school districts, such study to emphasize the amount of savings, if any, by such consolidation. The committee shall consist of 2 Senators to be appointed by the President of the Senate and 3 Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House. The President of the Senate shall designate the chairman.

Sec. 2. Meetings, expenses. The committee shall meet at the call of the chairman. The members shall be paid necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

Sec. 3. Report. The Committee shall report the results of its study together with any recommended legislation to the 103rd Legislature.

Sec. 4. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$2,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966. Said appropriation shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this Act have been accomplished.
