STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing Funds for Indian Day Celebration.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, in order to promote Indian Island and the Indians who live thereon the following legislation is necessary so that such promotion may be instituted as soon as possible; and

Whereas, Indian Day Celebration will be a great tourist attraction for Maine's visitors in the summer of 1965; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Funds for Indian Day Celebration. Resolved: That there is appropriated the sum of \$300 from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Penobscot Tribe of Indians, to be expended by the governor of the tribe for the Indian Day Celebration to be held on Indian Island in the summer of 1965.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Plans for Indian Day Celebration in the summer of 1965 should be started at once in order that the celebration will be a successful one.
