AN ACT Relating to Cutting Timber Near Waters and Highways.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, c. 215, sub-c. IX-B, additional. Chapter 215 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subchapter IX-B, to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER IX-B

CUTTING TIMBER NEAR WATERS AND HIGHWAYS

§ 1590. Cutting timber near waters and highways

No person shall cut timber within 100 yards of any lake, pond, river, stream or coastal waters, or of any highway, in such fashion as to leave the location of such timber cutting in an unsightly condition; and whoever cuts timber within 100 yards of any such lake, pond, river, stream or coastal waters, or of any highway, shall remove the slash resulting from such cutting operations or otherwise dispose of the same, by chipping or scattering such slash in such fashion as to leave no unsightly debris within view from such lake, pond, river, stream, coastal waters or highway. No person shall leave slash in any lake, pond, river, stream or coastal waters. Violation of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$500.
