SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 619, L. D. 1611, Bill, " An Act to Regulate the Practice of Psychologists."

Amend said Bill in that part designated "§3987." of section 1 by striking out all of the 2nd underlined sentence from the end (same in L.D. 1611) and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Said board may, upon satisfactory proof that any applicant or licentiate has been guilty of any of the above offenses, refuse to grant a license to said applicant upon a vote of at least 3 members of the board or the Administrative Hearing Commissioner, as designated in Title 5, chapters 301 to 307, may suspend or revoke a license of said licentiate.'
