**AN ACT Providing Separate Ballots for Voting for President and
Vice-President.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 21, § 702, sub-§ 4, amended. Subsection 4 of section 702 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 13-B of chapter 425 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

4. Order of offices. The order of offices on the ballot is as follows: ~~President and Vice-President~~ United States Senator, Governor, Representative to Congress, State Senator and Representative to the Legislature followed by the county offices.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 21, § 702, sub-§ 4-A, additional. Section 702 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subsection 4-A, to read as follows:

4-A. Presidential electors on separate ballot. The names of the candidates for President and Vice-President shall not be printed on the general election ballot but shall be printed on a separate ballot.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This legislation provides for a separate ballot for voting for President and Vice-President.
