AN ACT Clarifying the Valuation of Certain Lands at Current Use.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 36, § 566, additional. Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 566 to read as follows:

§ 566. Valuation of certain lands at current use

The Constitution of Maine, Article IX, section 8, as it relates to the valuation of certain lands at current use, shall apply only to family farms of not more than 500 acres, owned by one or more persons and not corporations, with not more than 5 full-time or part-time employees, or both, and to family-owned woodlots of not more than 500 acres.

The purpose of this bill is to implement the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, section 8.
