IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Permitting Class A Taverns to Sell Food.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 28, § 2, sub-§ 22-A, amended. Subsection 22-A of section 2 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:
- 22-A. Class A tavern. "Class A tavern" shall mean a reputable place operated by responsible persons of good reputation where no food is sold other than prepared packaged snacks and no business is carried on except the sale of eigarettes and tobacco products and except the sale of malt liquors are sold at tables, booths and counters, and where no minors shall be permitted to remain on the licensed premises. All such taverns shall comply with the rules and regulations of the Department of Health and Welfare and be licensed by same and this license fee shall be \$15.
