HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 588, L. D. 1740, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Operation of Pulpwood Trucks on Maine Highways."

Amend said Bill by inserting at the end of section 1, the following:

'Sec. 2. R. S., T. 29, § 1755, amended. The first paragraph of section 1755 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 195 of the public laws of 1969, is further amended to read as follows:

Every vehicle carrying objects which project more than 5 feet from the rear shall, during the period of 1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise, carry a red light at or near the rear end of the objects so projecting, and at all other times such vehicle shall carry a danger-signal clean red cloth of the dimensions

18 x 18 inches attached at or near the end of the object so projecting.'

Statement of Fact

It is the intent of this amendment to clarify the meaning of the words "danger signal."
