HOUSE AMENDMENT "B " to H. P. 1354, L. D. 1770, Bill, "AN ACT Regulating Roadside Clear Cutting Practices."

Amend said Bill in that part designated "<u>§ 519.</u>" by inserting before the first paragraph the following:

'In order to promote maximum safety of the users of public roads; to protect the public investment in such roads; to preserve and enhance the natural scenic beauty and aesthetic features of public roads; to prevent unreasonable distraction of motorists using public roads; to prevent erosion of the land bordering public roads; to prevent the accumulation of slash from clear cutting operations, which slash contributes to the danger of forest fires, and to promote the general health, safety and welfare of the public, the Legislature declares it to be in the public interest, for the public benefit and the good order of the people of the State, to regulate roadside clear cutting practices.'

Further amend said Bill in that part designated "<u>§ 519.</u>" in the 3rd line (same in L.D.) by striking out the underlined words "abutting and"

Further amend said Bill in that part designated "<u>§ 519.</u>" in the 2nd line of subsection 6 (first line in L.D.) by striking out the underlined word "<u>volume</u>" and inserting in place thereof the underlined words and figures 'trees within the 100-foot strip'

Further amend said Bill by inserting before the last paragraph the following:

'For purposes of this section, "tree" means any growing plant life having a diameter greater than 6 inches, measured one foot above ground level.'

Statement of Fact

The intent of this amendment is to add a purpose clause; and to define with greater precision terms used in the bill.
