SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1354, L.D. 1770, Bill, "AN ACT
Regulating Roadside Clear Cutting Practices."


Amend said Bill in that part designated "§519." by striking
out all of subsection 6 and inserting in place thereof the
following:

'6. Selective cutting which removes not more than 40% of
the trees within the 100-foot strip and returns a well distributed
stand of tree foliage, except that more than 40% may be removed if
a state forester so recommends or if a private forester with the
approval of the Forestry Department so recommends.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of the amendment is to clarify selective cutting
and to provide for more than 40% removal under certain conditions.
