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**AN ACT Providing for Restricted Motor Vehicle Operator's License.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 1312, sub-§ 10, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection 10 of section 1312 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by chapter 547 of the public laws of 1971, and as amended by section 1 of chapter 185 of the public laws of 1973, is further amended by adding after the first paragraph a new paragraph to read as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Title, the Secretary of State shall have the authority to issue a restricted license or permit to any person whose license or permit or privilege to operate a motor vehicle in this State has been suspended as a result of a conviction for a first offense of operating or attempting to operate under the influence of intoxicating liquor, provided such person has satisfactorily completed a rehabilitation program conducted under the auspices of the Secretary of State. Such license shall not be issued prior to 30 days from the date of suspension.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide for a restricted motor vehicle operator's license after suspension for first offense of operating under the influence.
