STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR

RESOLVE, Providing a Minimum Service Retirement Allowance Under the State Retirement Law for Alice Weston Wyman.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 106th Legislature in regular session provided for a minimum service retirement allowance for state employees and teachers of \$100 per month, if the member had 10 years of creditable service at retirement; and

Whereas, Alice Weston Wyman retired in 1931, prior to the effective date of such law; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to provide Alice Weston Wyman a minimum service retirement allowance of \$100 per month; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Alice Weston Wyman; retirement credit for state service. Resolved: That notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the Maine State Retirement System is directed to pay Alice Weston Wyman the minimum retirement allowance of \$100 per month as provided under the State Retirement Law.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Alice Weston Wyman retired from state service in 1931 following 23 years of employment with the State Auditor's Department. She would have been eligible to receive retirement under the then existing law if she had had 25 years of service. She lacked 2 years.
