COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 780, L. D. 2236, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Duties of the Attorney General."

Amend said Bill in section 1 by striking out in the 8th and 9th lines (7th line of L.D.) the words "the state boards and commissions" and inserting in place thereof the Collowing: 'the state-boards-and-commissions agencies of the State'

Further amend said Bill in section 1 by striking out in the 15th line (13th line of L.D.) the punctuation and words ", boards and commissions" and inserting in place thereof the following: ',-boards-and-commissions or agencies of the State'

Further amend said Bill in section 2 by striking out in the 5th line (4th and 5th lines of L.D.) the underlined words "board or commission" and inserting in place thereof the underlined words 'or an agency of the State'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the last paragraph of section 3 and inserting in place thereof the following:

'The Attorney General shall give his written opinion upon questions of law submitted to him by the Governor and Council, Secretary-of-State, Treasurer-of-State, Bank-Superintendent, Insurance Superintendent, State-Auditor-or head of any other state department, or any of the state boards-or commissions agencies or by either branch of the Legislature or any members of the Legislature on legislative matters.'
