# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR

AN ACT Appropriating Funds to Provide for the Operation of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Department of Public Safety, Maine Criminal Justice Academy, appropriation. There is appropriated to the Department of Public Safety from the General Fund the sum of \$211,117 for the administration and operation of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide the operating costs of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy. The Academy, which trains state, county and municipal law enforcement officers and criminal justice personnel, currently

operates primarily on federal funds, the future receipt of which cannot be guaranteed. This bill is part of the State Government Committee report on its assigned study of future funding for the Maine Criminal Justice Academy. The State Government Committee feels that there is a possibility that the amount requested may be reduced by transfers of funds from state agencies using the facilities of the Academy.
