**AN ACT to Exempt Charter and Tour Buses as a Public Place under the
Liquor Laws.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 2003, sub-§ 2, amended. Subsection 2 of section 2003 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end a new sentence to read as follows:

Public place as used in this section shall not include any bus as defined in Title 29, section 1, subsection 1-D, designated for charter or tour.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of this Act to exempt charter and tour buses as a public place under the liquor laws to encourage clubs, organizations or similar groups to utilize such transportation to and from sporting events and other destinations, as opposed to operating several motor vehicles to accommodate a number of persons making such trips after consuming alcoholic beverages.
