SENATE AMENDMENT "B " to S.P. 689, L.D. 2206, RESOLUTION,
Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Assure Revenues
for Bond Service and Prohibit State Bonding of Current
Expenditures.

Amend said Constitutional Resolution in the 3rd paragraph
by inserting at the end after the underlined word and
punctuation "bonds." the following: 'The prohibition on use
of proceeds from the sale of bonds to fund current expenditures
shall only apply to those bonds authorized on or after July 1,
1977.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to avoid possible
inconsistencies or uncertainties as to the application of
Article V, Part Fourth, Section 5 of the Constitution in
accordance with an attorney general's opinion.
