SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 2, L.D. 2, RESOLUTION,
Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Mandate the
Appropriation of Funds for State Employee and Teacher
Retirement Costs.

Amend the Resolution by striking out all of the title and
inserting in its place the following: 'RESOLUTION, Proposing
an Amendment to the Constitution to Mandate the Appropriation
of Funds for State Employee Retirement Costs.'

Further amend the Resolution by striking out all of the
question and inserting in its place the following:

"Shall the Constitution be amended as proposed by a
resolution of the Legislature to make mandatory the appropriation
of funds for state employee retirement costs?"

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to remove the reference
to teachers in the bill because teachers are already considered
state employees under the retirement system.
