STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Changing the Date of Primary Election to the First Wednesday after Labor Day.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 21 MRSA § 444, 2nd sentence, as last amended by PL 1975, c. 340, § 3, is further amended to read:

He must be enrolled, on or before April June 1st, in the party named in the petition, and must be eligible to file a petition as a candidate for nomination by primary election as provided in subsection 3 of section 134.

- Sec. 2. 21 MRSA § 445, sub-§ 9, as last repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 761, § 17, is amended to read:
- 9. When filed. It must be filed in the office of the Secretary of State by or before 5 p.m. on April June 1st of the election year in which it is to be used.
- Sec. 3. 21 MRSA § 445, sub-§ 11, as amended by PL 1971, c. 65, § 10, is further amended to read:
- 11. Petition challenged. Anyone who desires to challenge the validity of a candidate's primary petition as filed with the Secretary of State must notify the Secretary of State in writing setting forth his reasons wihin 7 days after April June 1st prior to the primary election.
- Sec. 4. 21 MRSA § 447, sub-§ 1, as amended by PL 1971, c. 65, § 11, is further amended to read:

- I. Limitation. Corrections or additional signatures may not be submitted after April June 1st prior to the primary election.
- Sec. 5. 21 MRSA § 448, as amended by PL 1973, c. 133, is further amended to read:

§ 448. Time of election

The primary election shall be held on the 2nd Tuesday of June first Wednesday after Labor Day of each general election year.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill is intended to shorten the time of political campaigns to the benefit of the candidates and the constituency.
