HOUSE AMENDMENT "A " to H.P. 17, L.D. 26, Bill, "AN ACT  
to Clarify the Laws Governing Vehicles Overtaking and Passing."

Amend the Bill by striking out all of that part designated  
"§1151-B." and inserting in its place the following:

'§1151-B. Audible signal on passing

During the hours from 1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before  
sunrise, a driver instead of giving any audible warning, may signal  
by flashing his headlights within 3 seconds from low beam to high  
beam and back to low beam.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment permits flashing of headlights instead  
of honking your horn as a nighttime passing signal.
