## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Delete the Requirement that a Candidate's Name on a General Election Ballot Must be Followed by a Community Designation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. 21 MRSA § 702, sub-§ 1, 1st ¶, as last repealed and replaced by P.L. 1973, c. 414, § 32, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
- I. Arrangement. The ballot shall contain the name, without any title, of each nominee, arranged under the proper office designation alphabetically with the surname first.
- Sec. 2. 21 MRSA § 702, sub-§ 2, ¶ F, as last amended by PL 1973, c. 414, § 34, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
  - F. Space for write-ins. At the end of the list of nominees to each office, there shall be left as many blank spaces as there are vacancies to be filled, in which a voter may write the name, with the surname first or last, without any title, of any person for whom he desires to vote.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill will remove the community designation from the listing of each candidate's name on the general election ballot.
