COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 462, L.D. 567, Bill, "AN ACT to Permit the Use of Salmon Eggs for Fishing Bait."

Amend the Bill in section 2 by striking out everything after the amending clause and inserting in its place the following:

This shall not apply to tropical fish which are for aquarium purposes, except piranhas, walking catfish and white amur (grass carp) ^{to} nor/the chemically preserved eggs of either the Atlantic sea run salmon or landlocked salmon.

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to specify that Atlantic sea run salmon eggs and landlocked salmon eggs used as bait must be chemically preserved.
