SENATE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1639, L.D. 1838, Bill, "AN ACT  
to Revise the Laws Relating to Barbers and Cosmetologists."

Amend the bill in section 10 in that part designated "§1652."  
by inserting at the end of subsection 2, after the semicolon,  
the following: 'and'

Further amend the bill in section 10 in that part designated  
"§1652." by striking out at the end of subsection 3, after the  
semicolon, the following: "and"


Further amend the bill in section 10 in that part designated  
"§1652." by striking out all of subsection 4.

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to remove from the bill the  
requirement that persons seeking registration to practice cosmetology  
shall pass an examination conducted by the State Board of Cosmetology.
