HOUSE AMENDMENT"**9**"to S.P. 772, L.D. 2209, RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Limit the Amount of Government Spending and Taxes which may be Made without Voter Approval.

Amend the resolution by striking out in the title everything after the word "Taxes" and before the period.

Further amend the resolution by striking out everything after the first paragraph and inserting in its place the following:

'Constitution, Art. I, §22, sub-§1 is enacted to read:

1. Control of appropriations. The Legislature shall enact prior to June 30, 1979 a Governmental Spending Limitation Act. All statutes enacted to carry out the purposes of this section shall require the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of each house present and voting.

<u>Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question;</u> <u>effective date.</u> Resolved: That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at the next general election in the month of November or special statewide election on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

HOUSE AMENDMENT"P"to S.P. 772, L.D. 2209

"Shall the Constitution be amended, as proposed by the first special session of the 108th Legislature to limit the amount of government spending and taxes?"

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The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the words "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns, and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation.

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

Statement of Fact

This amendment provides for a simple constitutional provision requiring the Legislature to enact a Governmental Spending Limitation prior to June 30, 1979 Act/, and requiring that all statutes enacted pursuant to this provision require a two-thirds vote of those present and voting.
