# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

### AN ACT to Establish a Uniform Allowance for Deputy Sheriffs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

30 MRSA § 958, sub-§ 4, is enacted to read:

4. Uniform allowance. Each full-time deputy shall receive an annual uniform allowance of \$200 a year. This allowance shall be paid in 2 installments of \$100 each, one in the month of January and one in the month of July, and shall not be considered part of, nor included in the payment of, compensation paid under subsection 1.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides each full-time deputy with an annual \$200 uniform allowance, to be paid in 2 installments of \$100 each, once in January and once in July.

A "full-time" deputy is defined in Title 30, section 853 as a deputy who is employed in county law enforcement for at least 40 hours a week and who is compensated on a salaried or per diem basis under Title 30, section 958, subsection 1. This definition, of course, includes full-time deputies working at county jails.
