# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Adjust Unemployment Benefits for Employees on Layoff who are Temporarily Recalled to Work by their Regular Employer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA § 1191, sub-§ 3, as last amended by PL 1977, c. 444, is further amended by adding, after the first sentence, the following new sentence:

An eligible individual who is on a temporary layoff from his regular, most recent employer and who receives earnings for partial employment from the same employer shall be paid with respect to that week a partial benefit in an amount equal to his weekly benefit amount less his net earnings paid or payable to him with respect to that week, provided the terms of the individual's layoff and seniority rights are covered by an existing collective bargaining agreement.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill is intended to remove disincentives to return to work for employees on temporary layoff who are recalled for part-time work.
