COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 246, L.D. 291, Bill, "AN ACT
Relating to Negotiations Involving State Employees under the Labor
Laws."

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting
clause and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §974 is enacted to read:

§974. Publication of initial proposals

Either party to negotiations may publicize the parties' written
initial collective bargaining proposals. No proposal may be
publicized until 10 days after both parties have made their ^{initial} proposal.

Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §979-P is enacted to read:

§979-P. Publication of initial proposals

Either party to negotiations may publicize the parties'
written initial collective bargaining proposals. No proposal may
be publicized until 10 days after both parties have made their
initial proposal.

Sec. 3. 26 MRSA §1035 is enacted to read:

§1035. Publication of initial proposals

Either party to negotiations may publicize the parties'
written initial collective bargaining proposals. No proposals may
be publicized until 10 days after both parties have made their
initial proposal.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to limit the bargaining proposals that may be publicized to each party's initial/written proposal. Either party may publicize them 10 days after both proposals have been made.

This provision has been placed in each of 3 collective bargaining acts, rather than in the definition section of Maine's open-meeting law.
