### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Increase the Statutory Penalty for Violating the Statute Concerning Advertising or Soliciting Workers During a Strike.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA § 921, last sentence, is amended to read:

Any person, firm, association or corporation who violates this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$500 subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$5,000, payable to the State, to be recovered in a civil action.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to increase the penalty for advertising or soliciting workers during a strike.
