SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P.
250, L.D. 295, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Constables and Special
Police Officers."

Amend the Amendment by striking out all of the last 5
lines before the statement of fact and inserting in their
place the following:

'A constable's certificate of appointment shall state whether
or not he is allowed to carry a weapon, concealed or unconcealed,
in the performance of his duties. Any limitation regarding
the use of a weapon shall only apply at those times when the
constable is performing his duties. A constable shall not
be allowed to carry a weapon if he is unable to provide proof
of possessing sufficient skill and knowledge in handling of
firearms in accordance with such standards of proficiency
as shall be adopted by the Chief of the State Police for the
implementation of this section.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to require that constables demonstrate their skill and knowledge in operating a firearm before being allowed to carry a weapon in the performance of their duties.
