STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT Concerning Killing of Wild Animals Destroying Property.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2354, sub-§ 7. as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 364, is amended to read:

7. Destruction of property. Except as provided in subsection 1 as it applies to deer, any person may lawfully kill, or cause to be killed, any wild animal night or day, except beaver or any wild bird, found in the act of attacking, worrying or wounding that person's domestic animals or destroying that person's property.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this legislation is to allow the department to regulate the taking of animals, such as bear and raccoon, whose populations may be adversely affected by over harvesting.
