SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P.166,
L.D. 373, Bill, "AN ACT to Repeal the License Requirement for
Taking Certain Clams."

Amend the Amendment by inserting after the first paragraph
the following:

'Further amend the Bill by inserting before the enacting
clause the following:

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Legislature previously and incorrectly included
"storm" clams within the 1/2 bushel limit for the taking of clams;
and

Whereas, the application of the 1/2 bushel limit would prevent
Maine citizens from using and enjoying the natural resources of
Maine during the summer of 1979; and


Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
safety; now, therefore, '

Further amend the Amendment by inserting at the end before
the Statement of Fact the following:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause to the bill.
