COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 172, L.D. 378, Bill, "AN ACT to Repeal the State Lottery Commission."

Amend the bill by inserting before the statement of fact, the following:

'Fiscal Note

Assuming this referendum is approved, there is a loss of revenue involved with this legislation of \$974,391 in <sup>fiscal year</sup> 1979-80 and \$2,211,121 in <sup>fiscal year</sup> 1980-81. In addition, there would be the cost of holding a special statewide election.

Further, if this referendum is approved it would result in an additional loss of revenue through the <sup>State</sup> Liquor Commission of \$100,000 per full year. This loss will occur as a result of commissions on sales and prices on lottery tickets sold at the state liquor stores.'
