**AN ACT to Extend the Time in which Appeals from Deputies' Decisions may be  
Taken in Unemployment Compensation Cases.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**26 MRSA § 1194, sub-§ 2, 4th ¶, 2nd sentence**, as amended by PL 1973, c. 147, is further amended to read:

Subject to subsection 11, unless the claimant or any such interested party, within ~~10~~ **30** calendar days after such notification was mailed to his last known address, files an appeal from such determination, such determination shall be final.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to extend the time limit in which appeals from deputies' decisions may be taken in unemployment compensation cases.
