STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Permit Municipal Constables to Serve as Full-time Deputy Sheriffs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

30 MRSA \S 951, last \P , as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 431, \S 4, is amended to read:

A full-time deputy shall not hold any other municipal, county or state office, **except that of constable** and may reside outside the county during the term of his appointment only with the permission of the sheriff and county commissioners.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill permits a person to serve as a municipal constable when not on duty as a full-time deputy sheriff.
