STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Require Construction Permits Prior to Building Hotels and Motels with 2 or More Stories.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

25 MRSA § 2448, first sentence, as last amended by PL 1975, c. 293, § 4, is further amended to read;

No person, firm or corporation shall construct a public building, school house, hospital, convalescent, nursing or boarding home to be licensed by the Division of Hospital Services, Department of Human Services, theater or other place of public assembly, hotels or motels of 2 or more stories or any building to be state owned or operated, without first obtaining from the Commissioner of Public Safety a permit therefor.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require a construction permit prior to building a new hotel or motel with 2 or more stories. The plans review required for a construction permit will insure that the proposed building meets life safety requirements.
