STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Require a Licensed Arborist to be on the Job Site of any Job Undertaken by an Arborist.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

32 MRSA § 2051-A is enacted to read:

§ 2051-A. Work performed by employees of arborists

No person who is not a licensed arborist and who is employed by or working with a licensed arborist shall perform any function set out as a function of an arborist in section 1951, subsection 1, unless the licensed arborist is present on the property on which the function is being performed.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require that the crew working for a licensed arborist cannot perform any of the functions of an arborist unless the arborist is present.
