STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Prohibit an Intentional Attempt to Elude a Police Officer through High-speed Driving.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 29 MRSA § 2121, 2nd \P , last sentence, as amended by PL 1975, c. 731, § 58, is further amended to read:

Failure to comply with this requirement shall be a misdemeanor Class E crime.

Sec. 2. 29 MRSA § 2121, as last amended by PL 1975, c. 731, § 58, is further amended by inserting after the 2nd paragraph the following new paragraph:

If the operator, after being so requested or signaled, attempts to elude the officer by driving his vehicle at an excessive rate of speed, and this attempt results in a high-speed chase between the operator's vehicle and any law enforcement vehicle using blue light and siren, that operation shall constitute a Class C crime.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides for a separate offense and penalty for high-speed attempts to elude apprehension. This legislation is intended as a deterrent to this extremely dangerous conduct.
